First Reading: Peter's Speech to the People of Jerusalem Acts 3:13-15. 17-19

Peter said to the people, "You are Israelites, and it is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our ancestors, who has glorified his servant Jesus, the same Jesus you handed over and then disowned in the presence of Pilate, after Pilate had decided to release him. It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just One, you who demanded the reprieve of a murderer while you killed the prince of life. God, however, raised him from the dead, and to that fact we are the witnesses. Now I know, brothers, that neither you nor your leaders had any idea what you were really doing; this was the way God carried out what he had foretold, when he said through all his prophets that his Christ would suffer. Now you must repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out."

Response to the Psalm: Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord.

Second Reading: Our Advocate with the Father 1 John 2:1-5

I am writing this, my children, to stop you sinning; but if anyone should sin, we have our advocate with the Father Jesus Christ, who is just; he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away, and not only ours, but the whole world's. We can be sure that we know God only by keeping his commandments. Anyone who says, 'I know him', and does not keep his commandments, is a liar, refusing to admit the truth. But when anyone does obey what he has said, God's love comes to perfection in him.

Gospel Acclamation: : Alleluia, Alleluia! Lord Jesus explain the scripture to us. Make our hearts burn within us as you talk to us. Alleluia!

The Gospel: (Luke 24:35-48): Fish for Supper

The disciples told their story of what had happened on the road and how they had recognised Jesus at the breaking of bread when Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you!" In a state of alarm and fright, they thought they were seeing a ghost. But he said, "Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes. Then he told them, "This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled." He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this."

Chapter 24 of Luke's Gospel covers three momentous events. First, we have the appearance of Jesus to a couple of the disciples on the road to Emmaus, then today's Gospel, and finally a remarkably understated account of the Ascension.

Today's Gospel hangs onto the mystery of the gradual recognition of Jesus as the walking partner as the sun gradually disappears on a parched track. The disciples are deep in debate about the questioning stranger who reveals himself as Jesus in the breaking of the bread as they eat together, taking them back to that final supper in the upper room. The eleven are talking together about Jesus and suddenly he is there with them. Yet again his very physical presence is met with incredulity. And who could blame them? Unlike us, well-versed in the narrative, they are unaware of their position at the pivot of humanity's fate.

Jesus patiently reiterates the significance of what he has preached to them so many times. HE IS the fulfillment of scripture; that yearning for a Messiah through the many pages of scripture and the cries of the prophets. Then comes the key phrase: "He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures." These men of little education as scriptural scholars, are being led into a necessary clarity...This process will be completed when they are filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Then, finally, their human weakness will be subsumed into a missionary fire. Their work will begin.

Jesus emphasizes their key role as witnesses, tasked with spreading the first roots of the message of Christ's Death and Resurrection and salvation for humanity. For them, of course, this witness will culminate in the blood witness of martyrdom.

In the global Christian community we live in, we too are called to witness, through our Baptism.

Pope Francis frequently returns to the nature of witness: "The witness of an authentically Christian life involves a journey to holiness...Witness, therefore, cannot be separated from consistency between what one believes, what one proclaims, and how one lives." 22 March 2023

Just as in today's Gospel, Jesus is nudging his nervous listeners towards their mission, so we should constantly pray for renewal and direction. Let us all be inspired by his constant risen presence in the peaks and troughs of our days.
