First Reading: Carrying on the Life of Jesus

Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said, "Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved."

Response to the Psalm: The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone.

Second Reading: Sharing the Heritage of Jesus 1John 3:1-2

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is.

Gospel Acclamation: : Alleluia, Alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me. Alleluia!

The Gospel: (John 10:11-18): The Good Shepherd

Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father."

We are ALL called to be Shepherds!

One of the most popular images of pastoral care is that of the Shepherd who leads his large flock and protects them from harm. Its also an image many people use to describe the relationship between the local priest and parishioners. This is a bit of a shame, really, because we've grown used to the idea that it is the priest who is THE pastoral worker in the community, rather than the responsibility belonging to all of us who are baptised.

When Jesus walked the earth, shepherding was a hazardous occupation. Outdoor living was tough. During the long dry season, they had to move their flocks in search of new pastures and watering places, they often trespassed on 'private land' so were unpopular with landowners. In common with tax collectors, they were forbidden to hold public office or give evidence in court. They weren't really respected by the local community.

The wandering figure of the good shepherd, anxiously tending his sheep to the point where he is prepared to surrender his life for them, is the image Jesus uses about himself in today's Gospel. It's a mixture of care, tenderness, toughness and self-sacrifice. It summarises his approach to leadership. It is not about

defensiveness or detachment. The image is not about religious authority, pleased with its own importance and sense of entitlement. It is of a deeply loving, caring person – something we're all called to. When we see how Jesus *actually* behaved as a leader, we see that he:

Tackled his opponents face to face.

Warns his followers about the tough times ahead. Endures being misunderstood when he includes the excluded.

Endures insult and isolation.

Commits to compassion and forgiveness. Seeks out the least, the lost and the last.

We all sign up for this when we're baptised! Though we might not realise it!

It is true that we do 'pray for Vocations' today – maybe we need, first of all, to pray that we all realise we are all called, and when our communities become compassionate and missionary communities, then there will indeed be women and men willing to explore what it might mean to be leaders within them. Let us pray heartily for that!
