First Reading: The Lord will Shepherd Israel

Jeremiah 23:1-6

"Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered - it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds - it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost - it is the Lord who speaks! See, the days are coming - it is the Lord who speaks - when I will raise a virtuous Branch for David, who will reign as true king and be wise, practising honesty and integrity in the land. In his days Judah will be saved and Israel dwell in confidence. And this is the name he will be called: The Lord-our-integrity."

Response to the Psalm: The Lord is my shepherd: there is nothing I shall want.

Second Reading: The Unity of Believers

Ephesians 2:13-18

In Christ Jesus, you that used to be so far apart from us have been brought very close, by the blood of Christ. For he is the peace between us, and has made the two into one and broken down the barrier which used to keep them apart, actually destroying in his own person the hostility caused by the rules and decrees of the Law. This was to create one single New Man in himself out of the two of them and by restoring peace through the cross, to unite them both in a single Body and reconcile them with God. In his own person he killed the hostility. Later he came to bring the good news of peace, peace to you who were far away and peace to those who were near at hand. Through him, both of us have in the one Spirit our way to come to the Father.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice, says the Lord, I know them and they follow me. Alleluia!

The Gospel: Gathering to be Fed

Mark 6:30-34

The apostles rejoined Jesus and told him all they had done and taught. Then he said to them, "You must come away to some lonely place all by yourselves and rest for a while"; for there were so many coming and going that the apostles had no time even to eat. So they went off in a boat to a lonely place where they could be by themselves. But people saw them going, and many could guess where; and from every town they all hurried to the place on foot and reached it before them. So as he stepped ashore he saw a large crowd; and he took pity on them because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at some length.

The Good Shepherd

The image that dominates our readings on this 16th Sunday is the image of the shepherd.

In the reading from the prophet Jeremiah, God is angry with those who are failing to care for his people "Disaster for the shepherds who loose and scatter the sheep of my pasture", in our much-loved Psalm 22 we hear that "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want" and in Mark's gospel the Good Shepherd is portrayed in action as we hear that "he took pity on the people because they were like sheep without a shepherd, and he set himself to teach them at great length." (Mark 6:30-34)

This image of the shepherd would have been so powerful to the community in which Jesus lived because the relationship between the shepherd and his sheep was extraordinarily close:

- 1. The shepherd didn't just go out in the morning or the evening to look after the sheep. He stayed with them throughout the day, sharing all of their hardships.
- 2. At night-time, he bought them into the sheepfold, every single one of them, in order to protect them from harm.
- 3. He didn't drive them, he led them by example. He walked in front of them, leading them to safety and, with complete confidence in him, they faithfully followed him.
- 4. He knew every one of them by name and if one went missing, he would go back out to search for the lost sheep and then bring it home with great rejoicing.
- 5. So the relationship between the shepherd and his sheep was one of knowledge, trust, protectiveness, concern and dependence.

When Our Lord talks about being Our Shepherd, he's using this beautiful pastoral image to tell us that he knows us intimately, leads us gently, cares for us tenderly, protects us faithfully, and no matter what happens, he is with us every day in the good times and especially in the most difficult times - "I am the Good Shepherd I lay down my life for my sheep" (John 10:14-15).

Through our own Baptism, Jesus has called and commissioned each one of us to follow him and, in our own lives, to provide Christ-like pastoral care for each other - "Feed my lambs... Feed my sheep" (John 21:15-17)
