Job 38.1. 8-11

Second Reading: The New Creation

2 Corinthians 5:14-17

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them. From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our mind, so that we can see what hope his call holds for us. Alleluia!

The Gospel: (Mark 4:35-41): Jesus Calms the Storm

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'

When I was a young child, I never used to like storms, especially the wind, particularly if my family and I were in the car travelling. Those who are familiar with the movie 'Up' might sympathise with me – I was terrified that the wind would lift us into the air, in a similar way to the balloons in the film. To this day, as a driver myself, travelling in storms is scary, and I often will avoid driving in such conditions.

In today's Gospel, the disciples are faced with a similar dilemma. Jesus has lead them out from the crowd and into a boat, where they cannot control the events which will occur. Jesus leads the disciples from a place of comfort and familiarity, to a place of discomfort and chaos, even danger. The wind picks up, and the boat starts sinking. All the while, Jesus is asleep on the boat, and is, in the disciple's eyes, totally un-phased by the events going on around them. Yet, here we see something beautiful take place, and Jesus allows his power as the Son of God to present itself. Jesus calms the storm with four words, and questions the disciples, asking them why, when they were supposed to have faith, they were so frightened.

Quite often, in Biblical literature, the sea represents chaos and turbulence, something the disciples experience in this passage. Yet, whilst Jesus calms the physical storm, he also calms the mental turmoil of the disciples by rebuking the wind and waves. Indeed, we can read this in both a physical and spiritual sense. Jesus calms the physical storm on the sea, but he also calms the storms in our lives. He silences the lies that tell us we are not worthy, or not good enough, and reminds us time and time again that we are beloved children of the Father. While the disciples fear they are drowning, Jesus, even appearing to be asleep, has control of the situation the entire time. I wonder, how often do we lean on our own understanding instead of trusting in the Lord? In the eye of the storm, this is something really difficult to do, but perhaps the Lord is calling us to trust and have faith in Him, remembering that Christ does not abandon the disciples in the storm; rather, He is in the boat, close beside us as He calms the rocky seas.
