First Reading: Peter Instructs Cornelius Acts 10:34.37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: "You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holv Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I. and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name."

Response to the Psalm: This day was made by the Lord: We rejoice and are glad.

Second Reading: New Life in Christ Colossians 3:1-4

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at

God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! Christ, our Passover, has been sacrificed: let us celebrate the feast then, in the Lord. Alleluia!

The Gospel: (John 20:1-9): The Empty Tomb

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb," she said, "and we don't know where they have put him." So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

We hear in John's Gospel that "*It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb.*" How amazing that this woman, who had accompanied Jesus throughout his ministry and even stood at the foot of the cross, was now given the awesome privilege of being the very first person to be entrusted with the Good News that Jesus Christ had "conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity."

Her response, and the response of every true disciple, was to share the good news with others and so she "came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved". Her joy was over-whelming and Peter and John responded by running as fast as they possibly could to witness for themselves this life-changing news of the Resurrection. How do we respond to the Good News that the Lord Jesus, who came to live amongst us as the Son of God and to share in our humanity, who revealed to us the tender love of the Father and was willing to suffer and die for us and offer to us the gift of Eternal Life? Do we live out the commission entrusted to us in our Baptism -"The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak. May he soon touch your ears to receive his word, and your mouth to proclaim his faith, to the praise and glory of God our Father." Does the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus transform our daily lives of faith so that "our hearts burn within us" and are we passionate in sharing the love of Christ with everyone that we meet? Do we just <u>speak</u> of our Christian faith, or do we demonstrate integrity in the way that we <u>live</u> our daily lives within our families, our relationships, our workplace and our parish communities?

Each and every-one of us is created in the image and likeness of God, is adopted by the Father through Baptism as a beloved daughter or son and is blessed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We each have a unique and irreplaceable contribution to make in building God's Kingdom, so let's all rejoice in the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus and proclaim the Good News to the whole world.

When we began Forward Together In Hope in 2014 we had 110 active priests in the Diocese. It is quite likely that by 2030 we will have much less than 50 active priests and far more who will need specialist care. These priests have spent their lives serving us in our diocese. We now have 86....and many will want to continue to serve without having the responsibilities of being a parish priest. Our collection goes to enabling them to live as full a life as they possibly can.
