First Reading: The Twelve Tribes of the New Israel, Acts of the Apostles 1:15-17. 20-26

One day Peter stood up to speak to the brothers – there were about a hundred and twenty persons in the congregation: 'Brothers, the passage of scripture had to be fulfilled in which the Holy Spirit, speaking through David, foretells the fate of Judas, who offered himself as a guide to the men who arrested Jesus – after having been one of our number and actually sharing this ministry of ours. 'In the book of Psalms it says: Let someone else take his office. 'We must therefore choose someone who has been with us the whole time that the Lord Jesus was travelling around with us, someone who was with us right from the time when John was baptising until the day when he was taken up from us – and he can act with us as a witness to his resurrection.' Having nominated two candidates, Joseph known as Barsabbas, whose surname was Justus, and Matthias, they prayed, 'Lord, you can read everyone's heart; show us therefore which of these two you have chosen to take over this ministry and apostolate, which Judas abandoned to go to his proper place.' They then drew lots for them, and as the lot fell to Matthias, he was listed as one of the twelve apostles.

Response to the Psalm: The Lord has set His sway in heaven.

Second Reading: God lives and loves in us, 1 John 4:11-16

My dear people, since God has loved us so much, we too should love one another. No one has ever seen God; but as long as we love another God will live in us and his love will be complete in us. We can know that we are living in him and he is living in us because he lets us share his spirit. We ourselves saw and we testify that the Father sent his Son as saviour of the world. If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in him and he in God. We ourselves have known and put our faith in God's love towards ourselves. God is love and anyone who lives in love lives in God, and God lives in him.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! I will not leave you orphans, says the Lord; I will come back to you, and your hearts will be full of joy. Alleluia!

The Gospel: John 17:11-19 Sharing Christ's joy to the full

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said: 'Holy Father, Keep those you have given me true to your name, so that they may be one like us. While I was with them, I kept those you have given me true to your name. I have watched over them and not one is lost except the one who chose to be lost, and this was to fulfil the scriptures. But now I am coming to you and while still in the world I say these things to share my joy with them to the full. I passed your word on to them, and the world hated them, because they belong to the world no more than I belong to the world. I am not asking you to remove them from the world, but to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth; your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world, and for their sake I consecrate myself so that they too may be consecrated in truth.'

Newsletter reflection for Seventh Sunday of Easter

From the age of 11 until my early 20s, I was training for the priesthood with the Xaverian Missionary Fathers. I attended their junior seminary at Coatbridge in Lanarkshire and eventually went on to complete my novitiate year in Italy and then moved to London to study Philosophy and Theology. During that time I met and fell head over heels in love with Chris and realised God had a different plan for me - we'll be 39 years married this year!

Although I did go on to finish my degree courses, there was a year after I left the Xaverians when I got a job working at the BBC in Shepherd's Bush while I tried to figure out where God was calling me next. That year changed my whole perspective on my faith. I went from being fully immersed in a deeply religious Catholic environment, to working in a completely secular context. It was as if you could have taken a cross-section of society and put them all in the same office - and the surprising thing was that I found signs of God's presence there. I was nervous to talk about my religious background but they just accepted me and were curious about it. They were something of a motley crew: some dabbled in recreational drugs, some liked a drink (I might have been in that group!), some were in and out of relationships, some were married, some were gay, one or two had a loose religious affiliation, and so on.

But underlying all of the above was a genuine care for others. If anyone was going through a hard time we would rally round. If anyone was short of cash we would all chip in. My friend Rick's mum died and we all went to support him at the funeral. Through all these small gestures and attitudes I started to recognise gospel values and so I found God's grace in that secular place. When I read the gospel stories, I started to notice that Jesus was always spending time with the wrong kind of people - he seemed to be drawn to the misfits and the outcasts and seemed to get nothing but hassle from the religious authorities.

Since that year at the BBC, I always look for signs of God's presence in unexpected places. Today's second reading from St John says: *'God is love and anyone who lives in love lives in God, and God lives in them'*. So, let's look for the love; let's look for the signs of care and compassion; let's be slow to condemn and quick to affirm; let's look for potential in people rather than point out their mistakes. Let's try to be more like Jesus!
